DSU, TheDream.US Announce Scholarship Partnership

DELAWARE STATE UNIVERSITY AND THEDREAM.US have jointly announced a historic partnership that will implement a unique scholarship program for immigrant high school graduates who live in states that make a college education for them virtually impossible.

TheDream.US Opportunity Scholarship is the nation's largest scholarship program for DREAMers – immigrant youth who came to the U.S. without documentation. The organization has partnered with Delaware Gov. Jack Markell and Connecticut Gov. Dannel Malloy and their respective state universities – DSU and Eastern Connecticut State University – to provide scholarship recipients with admissions to institutions of higher education where they can enroll and fulfill their college aspirations.

New Scholarship Fund Gives Dreamers a Chance at a College Education

The Community College of Denver (CCD) and THEDREAM.US foundation have partnered to provide scholarships to qualified immigrant students, or “DREAMers.” TheDream.US is the national's largest scholarship program that targets undocumented immigrant students who have DACA/TPS status who are not eligible to apply for federal financial aid to support a college education.

Scholarships will cover up to 100 percent of a student's total cost of tuition, fees and books at CCD.

Both high school students coming to CCD as well as graduates who wish to finish their bachelor's degree at a partner university are eligible to apply.

“We are excited to be able to serve DREAMers in Colorado, which is the home of many highly motivated DREAMers who want nothing more than to go to college and contribute to their families and the Denver community,” said Candy Marshall, president of TheDream.US.

Valencia College and the University of Central Florida Partner with TheDream.US to Open College Doors for DREAMers

Thanks to a new private funding agreement with TheDream.US, Valencia College and UCF will offer college scholarships to eligible students through their DirectConnect to UCF program. The scholarships will help DREAMers excel academically and graduate from college with a degree and career-ready skills to enter the workforce.

TheDream.US is an organization that provides college scholarships to highly motivated DREAMers—undocumented immigrants who were brought to the United States as children. The American Immigration Council estimates that there are close to 90,000 DREAMers in Florida. Of those, about 200 receive the scholarship, which can range from \$12,500 for an associate degree and \$25,000 for a bachelor's degree.

CAL STATE SAN BERNARDINO: Scholarships for undocumented students

Cal State San Bernardino is the latest of 20 colleges and universities nationwide to join THEDREAM.US, a privately funded scholarship program for undocumented-immigrant students.

Scholarship recipients are eligible for grants that cover up to 100 percent of tuition, fees and books. To qualify, students must attend one of the 20 participating institutions.

“This program offers a wonderful opportunity for students who would be shut out of higher education despite their academic successes, qualifications and financial needs,” Cal State San

Bernardino President Tomás Morales said in a statement. “This initiative will help our university provide our students with the opportunity to achieve their academic and career goals, and in turn benefit our society as they become contributing members of the workforce in their communities.”
