- Panel discussions - sharing peer experiences
  - Scholars and Alumni who have started their own business
  - Please note: Scholar and Alumni panelists will be paid through our Ambassador Program. For a one-time, in-person, 1-2 hour event; a standard rate of \$150.00 per panelist will apply. Please note, this rate is inclusive of any additional time panelists spend on prep and travel outside of the event itself.
- Roundtable discussions
  - Break out attendees by Field of Study/Career Interests and facilitate discussion
- Networking activities
  - Utilizing LinkedIn
  - Connecting Scholars with Alumni
